

WE WIN 5 MORE AWARDS

THE Sun's gardens are winners again – after dazzling judges at this week's BBC Gardeners' World Live.

Sun Flower Street's four displays each won awards at the Birmingham NEC show – and we won the supreme accolade, Best Feature In Show.

That follows the eight gongs we won at last month's Chelsea Flower Show.

Our Cinzano-sponsored entries for the showcase, which ends tomorrow, form a row of terraced-home front gardens.

Will Sibley's Maximum Cropping Fruit Garden won a silver-gilt medal. He reckons his plot of just 19½ft square will yield a 500lb crop within five years of planting. With trees planted just 15in apart, it produces apples, pears and plums galore. Admirers can even buy tree specimens Will has grafted for them, such as the Braeburn apple tree he is holding above.

Will's exclusive new dwarf raspberries are also a hit. These 18in marvels are ideal for tiny plots or pots, and need no support wire.

Our Miracle-Gro

Celebrity Rose Garden won a silver medal for its lovely Rolawn lawn, easy-care blooms and wooden pergola. Created by Jack Sexton of Class Gardens, Hertford, it pulled in celebrity visitors including garden makeover expert Charlie Dimmock – pictured with our Steve Bradley, *below* – and Rachel de Thame, the Gardeners' World presenter, who each named a rose bush.

Our Cinzano Garden features a patio where visitors can taste wine made with the garden's spices and herbs. It was designed by Reg Wadie and built by Bob Hewitt, both from Horsham, West Sussex, and scooped a bronze medal.

Last but not least is our Small Garden With Large Pretensions, by Pershore College, Worcs.

Its pretty porch, Astro-turf path and hot-coloured plantings also won a bronze.
